

Iran, Saudi Arabia to restore ties in China-brokered deal

To reopen embassies in two months; Islamabad, Beijing, UN, Hezbollah welcome normalisation of diplomatic ties; White House official says US welcomes any efforts to help end Yemen war, de-escalate tensions in Middle East; Israeli ex-PM calls it serious, dangerous development; Tehran thanks Iraq, Oman, China for hosting talks; world media indicates Saudi Arabia is asking Americans to provide security guarantees and help to develop civilian nuclear programme; Washington tries to broker diplomatic relations between kingdom and Israel

ISLAMABAD: As a result of talks between top security officials of Iran and Saudi Arabia in Beijing, the two countries agreed on Friday to re-establish relations after years of hostility.

The deal was announced after four days of previously undisclosed talks in Beijing between top security officials from the two rival Middle Eastern powers.

Tehran and Riyadh agreed to resume diplomatic relations and re-open embassies within two months, according to a statement

issued by Iran, Saudi Arabia and China. "The agreement includes their affirmation of the respect for the sovereignty of states and the non-interference in internal affairs," it said.

Pakistan warmly welcomed the normalisation of diplomatic relations between the two Islamic countries, which will have far-reaching impact on the geo-strategic relations of the regional countries and help address the thorny disputes of the region.


The formal official reaction was issued by the Foreign Office, followed by Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto

Zardari in New York, where he spoke high of the three countries which were part of the deal.

The FO said Pakistan firmly believed that the important diplomatic breakthrough would contribute to peace and stability in the region and beyond. "We commend the role played by China's visionary leadership in coordinating this historic agreement which reflects the power of constructive engagement and meaningful dialogue.

IMF not being fair to Pakistan: Bilawal

Says country faces a 'perfect storm of crises'; terms Islamophobia biggest problem

NEW YORK: Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari has stated that the International Monetary Fund (IMF) is not being fair to Pakistan, adding that the country was in a "perfect storm" of crises.

In a wide-ranging interview with the foreign media on Friday, Bilawal said that Pakistan was facing an economic crisis, the consequences of last year's catastrophic flooding and terrorism which was "once again rearing its ugly head".

Sharply criticising the IMF, Bilawal said the PPP supported expanding revenue collection and believed those who were well off should pay more. But he added that Pakistan had been unable to achieve structural tax reform "for the last 23 IMF programmes that we have been a part of."

"Is it really the time to nitpick about our tax policy and tax collection while we're suffering from a climate catastrophe of this scale?" Bilawal asked.

The IMF is not being fair to Pakistan, which is also dealing with 100,000 new refugees following the West's withdrawal from Afghanistan and "a steady uptick of terrorist activities within our country," he was quoted as saying.

The foreign minister further said that the IMF was stretching out talks at a time when the country needed money to help the "poorest of the poor."

"And they're being told that until their tax reform is not complete, we will not conclude the IMF programme."

He said that Pakistan was able to navigate the Covid-19 pandemic, the Taliban takeover of Afghanistan, as well as inflation and supply chain disruptions. But then last year's floods devastated the country, he said, calling it the "biggest, most devastating climate catastrophe that we've ever experienced."

He further said that Pakistan had a "very healthy

PBC files complaint in SJC against Justice Mazahir

Calls for inquiry against SC judge on basis of audio leaks, accumulation of assets beyond income

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Bar Council (PBC) Friday filed a complaint of misconduct in the Supreme Judicial Council (SJC) against Justice Sayyed Mazahir Ali Akbar Naqvi, a judge of the Supreme Court, praying for initiating an inquiry against him and removing him as a judge of the apex court.

The complaint was jointly filed by Chairman Pakistan Bar Council Haroon Rashid and Hassan Raza Pasha, Chairman Executive Com-

mittee of the Council, under Section 5(1) of the Supreme Judicial Council Procedure of Inquiry, 2005, read with Article 209 of the Constitution.

They submitted that the purpose of accountability of judges of the superior courts on the basis of their conduct prejudicial to the judicial office held by them had been left to the judges of Supreme Court itself within the meaning of Article 209(8) of the Constitution.

Last month, the PBC had

Time for KP, Punjab polls not 'suitable', ECP told

Intelligence agencies, CTDs brief ECP on security threats, challenges; proposal floated to defer elections by three to four months

ISLAMABAD: Representatives from the Inter-Services Intelligence, the Intelligence Bureau and Counter Terrorism Departments on Friday briefed the Election Commission of Pakistan on security threats and challenges.

Sources privy to the meeting told The News here that all the representatives of intelligence agencies and CTDs unanimously pointed out that the time was not suitable for elections in Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa in view of the fresh wave of terrorism and intelligence reports, which suggested that more terrorist attacks couldn't be ruled out.

A day after the Election Commission received a briefing from the ministries of finance and interior vis-à-vis its preparations for the upcoming polls to Punjab

Assembly, as well as Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Assembly, Chief Election Commissioner Sikandar Sultan Raja chaired another meeting and agencies briefed the forum on security and terrorism.

In addition to the members and senior officers of the ECP, the meeting was also attended by representatives from the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), Intelligence Bureau (IB) and counter-terrorism departments (CTDs) of the two provinces, which reviewed the security scenario and related arrangements to ensure peace during the electoral processes in the two provinces.

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan has announced the polls schedule in Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa but political leadership is still not sure if they will be held or not. There are 10 reasons why it is highly unlikely that elections will be held as per the announced schedule.

After announcing the election schedule in Punjab and KP, the Election Commission of Pakistan held a meeting presided over by Chief Election Commissioner and discussed

the arrangements for the upcoming general elections. A PTI delegation, headed by Shah Mehmood Qureshi, also visited the ECP and held a meeting with the ECP authorities. According to experts, regardless of the announcement of the schedule, the overall country's atmosphere doesn't look like there will be elections in the coming 60 days.

Five terrorists killed in North, South Waziristan: ISPR

PESHAWAR: Five terrorists were killed by security forces in intelligence-based operations (IBOs) in North and South Waziristan, the ISPR said on Friday.

In a press release, the Inter Services Public Relations said: "On March 10, IBOs were conducted by security forces in North and South Waziristan districts. During the operations, five terrorists were killed after intense fire exchange."

The ISPR added that weapons, ammunition and a large quantity of equipment were also recovered from them.

"Pakistan Army is determined to eliminate the menace of terrorism from every inch of our territory with an unflinching resolve," the statement said.

ACE collects Bhatti's record

LAHORE: The Anti-Corruption Establishment officials on Friday raided the Punjab Assembly and obtained important record against Muhammad Khan Bhatti, former principal secretary to Pervaiz Elahi.

Sources said the record of recruitments, transfers and postings had been obtained from the Punjab Assembly. The officials spent three hours to check the record in the Punjab Assembly. The record of benefits and allowances received by Bhatti was also seized.

Ozone pollution linked to increased heart disease

PARIS: Ozone air pollution is linked to a higher rate of hospitalisations for heart diseases, according to a large study released on Friday, the latest warning of the health dangers posed by greenhouse gases.

While a layer of ozone in the upper atmosphere helps block harmful ultraviolet (UV) radiation from reaching Earth, at ground level it is a major component of the smog polluting most big cities.

Scientists have warned that a different kind of air pollution, fine particulate matter known as PM2.5, causes 8.8 million premature deaths a year, but ozone's full impact on health is still becoming clear.

Ozone is created in the atmosphere by a chemical reaction when two pollutants, often emitted by cars or industry, combine in the

Pakistan to miss wheat production target, again

Production likely to remain 26.7m tonnes against target of 28.4m tonnes

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's wheat production target is likely to hit by 1.7 million tonnes for the current fiscal year as the Met office has forecast heavy rains for two weeks, starting from the third week of March.

Officials said on Friday that wheat production in Punjab is set to witness a major blow during the current fiscal year 2022-23, amid negative impacts of climate change as well as crop substitution, sowing other crops than wheat for profitability.

He added that the wheat production is likely to remain around 26.7 million tonnes as against the envisaged wheat production target of 28.4 million tonnes.

Besides, there is a looming shortage of wheat in the next fiscal year as well and the government will have to count on the import of wheat in order to meet the domestic requirements of staple food. The import of wheat is going to witness an upsurge at a time when the country is facing the worst-ever dollar

liquidity crunch. "There will be no other option but to import 3-3.5 million tonnes of wheat for the next fiscal year in order to meet domestic as well as Afghanistan's requirements. This is more than the import target of 2.6 million tonnes of wheat for the current fiscal year," top official sources confirmed while talking to The News here on Friday.

When Secretary Ministry of National Food Security & Research Zafar Hassan was contacted for inquiring about the wheat production target and reasons for crop substitution in Punjab, he replied that the wheat production target was not revised so far.

However, he said the wheat production is expected to remain around 27 million tonnes, whereas the actual figure will be obtained after harvesting. He added that the crop substitution was towards maize and oilseeds mainly due to better prices.

Official data available with The News disclosed that the government had sought wheat sowing area

target of 22.85 million acres in the country for the fiscal year 2022-23, including a sowing target of 16.48 million acres in Punjab. But only 16.01 million acres could be sown in the province till the latest compiled estimates, witnessing an achievement of 97.17 percent target.

It is relevant to mention here that in Punjab, the crop substitution occurred as farmers diverted towards oil seeds, keeping in view of getting improved returns.

Interestingly, Sindh surpassed its sowing target of wheat as the staple food was sown on the area of 2.945 million acres as against the sowing target of 2.79 million acres for the current fiscal year.

According to initial estimates, Sindh has harvested 25 percent of its cultivated area where per acre yield recorded as 40 tonnes.

In KP, the wheat was sown on area around 1.933 million acres as against the envisaged target of 2.22 million acres, achieving only

US lawmakers vote to declassify intel on Covid origins

WASHINGTON: The US House of Representatives voted unanimously on Friday to declassify information on potential links between the Covid-19 pandemic and a Chinese laboratory suspected of leaking the deadly virus.

The Senate had already voted last week to require Director of National Intelligence Avril Haines to declassify the material, meaning the bill now goes to the White House for President Joe Biden's signature.

The Covid-19 outbreak began in 2019 in the eastern

Chinese city of Wuhan, leading to almost seven million deaths worldwide so far, according to official counts, over a million of them in the United States.

But health officials and the US intelligence community remain divided over whether it was spread to humans from an infected animal or escaped from the Wuhan Institute of Virology.

The US Energy Department concluded with "low confidence" that the virus

AI-based medical laboratory starts functioning in capital

To provide free cervical-cancer screening to 10,000 women

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan-China joint Artificial Intelligence (AI) medical diagnosis laboratory in Islamabad has been put into operation.

Chinese diplomatic sources told the media on Friday that the laboratory was located in the Akbar Niazi Teaching Hospital of

the federal capital's Bhara Kahu area, which will provide free cervical-cancer screening to 10,000 Pakistani women in its first phase of operation.

It can also be used in the early diagnosis of other high incidence clinical tumors, such as breast cancer,

Haj to be 50pc pricier this year

Haj Policy announced; 179,210 Pakistanis to perform Haj; 14 banks to start receiving applications from 15th or 16th; balloting in first week of April; Saudi govt allows people above 65 to perform Haj; pilgrims from 2016 through 2022 ineligible

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Religious Affairs Mufti Abdul Shakoor Friday announced Haj Policy 2023 according to which 179,210 Pakistanis would make a pilgrimage this year.

Addressing a press conference here, the minister said the government would receive \$194 million from the overseas Pakistanis under the sponsorship scheme. The same amount would be spent on payment of Haj dues in Saudi Arabia.

Mufti Shakoor said Finance Minister Senator Ishaq Dar committed to arrange 90 million dollars, as a total of 284 million dollars would be required for payment of dues to the Saudi authorities.

Owing to depreciation of Pakistani currency, the Haj expenses as compared to the last year have increased

by over 50%.

The estimated expenses for the intending pilgrims from the northern region that ends at Rahim Yar Khan would be Rs1,175,000 (Regular Haj Scheme) and \$4,325 (Sponsorship Scheme).

Similarly, the expenses for intending pilgrims from the southern region would be Rs1,165,000 (Regular Scheme) and 4,285 US dollars (Sponsorship Scheme).

The regular and private scheme Haj operators each would get a quota of 89,605. However, a quota of 44,802 would be deducted from both schemes for the sponsorship scheme for which the Haj expenses would be received in foreign exchange from abroad.

The minister made it clear that no payment in foreign exchange would be received from within the

country. The successful applicants under the sponsorship scheme would be selected on first come first served basis while balloting would be conducted for selection of intending pilgrims under the regular scheme if the number of intending pilgrims increased beyond the allotted quota.

The minister said depending on permission from the Ministry of Finance, the designated branches of 14 schedule banks would start receiving applications from March 15 or 16.

The applicants for Regular Haj scheme should have single or joint bank account. Balloting for the Regular Haj scheme would be conducted during the first week of next month.

Tribal elders oppose KP Assembly polls ahead of census

PESHAWAR: Elders belonging to the merged districts on Friday opposed holding the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Assembly elections ahead of the population census and termed it a conspiracy against the people of the erstwhile tribal areas.

The elders, Haji Akhtar Gul, Maulana Rafiuddin, Muhammad Shoaib and others, said that their area was denied representation in the Upper House of Parliament before the merger. "And now the provincial assembly seats are being reduced," said Akhtar Gul.

The elders said that their area had been deprived of basic amenities for the last 20 years.

"More than half of the population has not been included in the previous census. And more than 10 million population of our region has been declared as five million in the previous census," Akhtar Gul added.

The elders said that they expected to get justice in the new population census.

The elders said that the government had also promised Rs100 billion for these districts in the NFC Award

BHC suspends Imran's arrest warrant for two weeks

Quetta court had issued non-bailable arrest warrant against PTI chief

QUETTA: The Balochistan High Court suspended on Friday a non-bailable warrant for the arrest of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Imran Khan for two weeks.

Justice Zaheer-Ud-Din Kakar was hearing a plea seeking dismissal of the case against Imran. The plea was filed by Insaf Lawyers Forum's (ISF) Iqbal Shah on behalf of the PTI chief.

A local court in Quetta had issued the arrest warrant for the PTI chief a day back in a case of incitement against state institutions, which is registered in Balochistan's capital.

The PTI chief maintained that the allegation under which the case was registered did not take place within the limits of the Bijli

Road police station and hence, doesn't fall under its jurisdiction. The petition urged the BHC to dismiss the FIR.

Justice Kakar, while suspending the warrant, issued summons for the Balochistan Police chief, SP legal and the SHO in the case.


The hearing was then adjourned for two weeks.

The high court's decision came shortly after a team of the Quetta Police reached Lahore with the non-bailable warrant to arrest Imran Khan.

The police team included Superintendent of Police (SP) Investigations Nadeem, Deputy Superintendent of Police Abdul Sattar, a sub-inspector and two other officers. They were to be assisted by the Lahore

Amendments to NAB law proposed: Azam

ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Law and Justice Azam Nazeer Tarar on Friday said the government had proposed amendments to sections IV and V of the NAB law with regard to references returned by the accountability courts.

An ordinance would be issued by the parliament, he said, adding that the accountability courts had been given powers to transfer the references to relevant forums if these did not fall in their jurisdictions.

Addressing a press conference here, he said there had been rumours about the future of references returned by the accountability courts recently, adding that indeed these references were not quashed. Instead, only their forums had been changed. He said the chairman NAB would be authorized to send inquiries to relevant institutions. However, investigations into various matters could be closed only if the court would be satisfied.

The deputy chairman NAB would use all the powers of the chairman in his absence. He said that previously, the NAB had been accused of political engineering and the apex court had observed the same in the Saad Rafiq case.

The PMLN leadership was acquitted of NAB references by courts under the previous law, he said, adding that the PTI government had used the NAB for political purposes.

Imran Khan introduced three ordinances during his tenure.

To a question, the minister said that under Article 19 of the Constitution, the Toshakhana record from 2000 onwards would be made public soon. He said that compiling the Toshakhana record since 1947 was a time consuming exercise. He said there was a need that every institution has a self-accountability system.—APP

Xi handed historic third term as Chinese president

BEIJING: Xi Jinping was handed a third term as Chinese president on Friday, capping a rise that has seen him become the country's most powerful leader in generations.

His appointment by China's parliament comes after Xi locked in another five years as head of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) in October.

On Friday, delegates handed Xi a third term as president and re-appointed him head of the country's Central Military Commission in a unanimous vote.

Beijing's Great Hall of the People, a cavernous state building on the edge of Tian-

anmen Square, was adorned with crimson carpets and banners for the landmark vote, with a military band providing background music.

A digital monitor on the edge of the stage proclaimed the final tally -- all 2,952 votes had been cast in favour of giving Xi another term in the office.

The announcement was followed by delegates' fervent declarations of allegiance to the Chinese constitution, in a demonstration of loyalty and unanimity.

Xi held up his right fist and placed his left hand on a red, leather-bound copy of China's constitution.

In an oath beamed live on

state television, he vowed to "build a prosperous, strong, democratic, civilised, harmonious and great modern socialist country".

China's close ally Russia swiftly offered Xi its "sincere congratulations" on his re-election. "Russia highly values your personal contribution toward the strengthening of ties and strategic cooperation between our nations," President Vladimir Putin said in a letter to Xi.

Also on Friday Wang Huning, a close Xi ally known for his prowess in ideological theory, was elected chairman of the

Pakistan again asks India for joint probe

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Friday once again reiterated its concern and asked India for a joint probe into an irresponsible incident in which India fired a BrahMos supersonic missile into Pakistani territory on March 9, 2022.

BrahMos, a nuclear-capable cruise missile, jointly

developed by Russia and India, saw the Pakistan Air Force assessing that the missile travelled three times the speed of sound at an altitude of 12,000m (40,000ft) and flew 124km (77 miles) in the Pakistani airspace before crashing. Luckily, no lives were lost in this reckless incident.

The Pakistan military at

the time had said that the missile had "endangered many passenger and international flights in Indian and Pakistani airspace" as well as "human life and property on the ground".

However, at the time, Pakistan reacted maturely and did not react to what
